Assertoric commitment

Several authors have attempted to characterize assertion in terms of the undertaking of a specific kind of responsibility: being 'committed' to the truth of a proposition. Through a brief historical overview, I will introduce the key linguistic data supporting commitment-based accounts of assertion, and put forward a tentative taxonomy of their main versions. I will then consider the key objections to commitment-based accounts, and present some new solutions to respond to these challenges.
